RESOLUTION 2018-01

Safeguard of Rural Landowner Property Rights

TO PREVENT FEDERAL, STATE, OR LOCAL INFRINGEMENT ON THE PROPERTY RIGHTS OF RURAL LANDOWNERS IN THEIR PURSUIT OF LIFE AND LIBERTY, AND MAY BE CITED AS THE "SAFEGUARD OF RURAL LANDOWNER PROPERTY RIGHTS" RESOLUTION; NULLIFYING ALL FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL ACTS IN VIOLATION OF THE 3RD, 4TH AND 5TH AMENDMENTS TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION AND ARTICLE I, SECTION 8, 10 AND 23 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA. NONCOMPLIANCE AND NONENFORCEMENT WITH ACTS IN VIOLATION OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA AND THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES.

WHEREAS, the 4th Amendment to the United States Constitution states: "The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized."

WHEREAS, Article I, Section 8 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania states: "The people shall be secure in their persons, houses, papers and possessions from unreasonable searches and seizures, and no warrant to search any place or to seize any person or things shall issue without describing them as nearly as may be, nor without probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation subscribed to by the affiant."

WHEREAS, the 5th Amendment to the United States Constitution states: "No person shall be... deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of the law; nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation."

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Oath of Office, all elected local, state and federal officers are sworn to protect and defend the U.S. Constitution.

WHEREAS, laws not passed in "pursuance" of the Constitution are null and void from their inception.

WHEREAS, all federal, state or local ordinances, actions, orders, resolutions, rules, or regulations regarding non emergency or unconstitutional Warrantless government access to private property shall be in violation of the 4th and 5th Amendments to the Constitution of the United States and Article I, Sections 8, 10 and 23 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that I, Casey J. Grove, Constable of Gregg Township, Centre County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, hereby declare that all federal, state, or local ordinances, actions, orders, resolutions, rules, or regulations regarding non emergency or unconstitutional Warrantless government access to private property shall be in violation of the 4th and 5th Amendments to the Constitution of the United States and **Article I, Sections 8, 10 and 23 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania**; are not authorized by the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; violate its true meaning and intent as given by the Founders and Ratifiers; were and are null and void from their inception and will not be implemented.

enforced, or otherwise supported in this Commonwealth by the Office of Constable of Gregg Township. It is the express policy of the Constable that no officer, employee, or agent of the Constable's Office, including any Deputy Constable or member of a posse under the command of the Constable or a Deputy Constable, may implement, enforce or otherwise support, directly or indirectly, any unconstitutional federal, state, or local ordinances, actions, orders, resolutions, rules, or regulations regarding non fire or medical emergency, or unconstitutional Warrantless government access to private property, and that they are specifically rejected by the Constable and the Office of Constable of Gregg Township. A violation of such policy by a Deputy Constable, officer, employee, agent, or member of a posse under the command of the Constable or a Deputy Constable, will be deemed a violation of their oath of office and/or employment, and will subject them to discipline up to and including termination and potential arrest.

FURTHER, it shall be the duty of the Constable and the Office of Constable of Gregg Township, within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, to adopt and enact any and all measures as may be necessary to prevent the enforcement of any federal, state or local ordinances, laws, orders, rules, or regulations in violation of the 4th and 5th Amendments to the Constitution of the United States along with Article I, Sections 8, 10 and 23 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or any violation of this resolution.

FURTHER, it shall be the duty of the Constable to support the right of Landowners to refuse to permit any access, search, audit, assessment, inspection, civil service or investigation whatsoever on their private property without the presentation of a Constitutional Warrant or Contract. It is the express policy of the Constable that allegations without probable cause, exigent circumstances, or non-scientific based precautionary principles; alleged zoning, land use code, sewage enforcement, environmental protection violations; or allegations made by anonymous sources to child protective services agencies, do not establish Constitutional or exigent circumstances for government to enter private property without a Constitutional Warrant.

FURTHER, in keeping with my oath to support, obey and defend the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of this Commonwealth, I hereby express my commitment to interpose this Office and stand in defense of all persons including citizens and lawful residents of the United States within Gregg Township, against attempts by agents of the Federal, State, County, or other local government to subject the citizens to unconstitutional search or seizure of their private property or children.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, recognizing my oath-bound duty to support, obey, and defend the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of this Commonwealth, as well as recognizing the duty of "We the People" to protect our unalienable natural rights to "Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness" as illustrated in the Declaration of Independence, I, Constable Casey J. Grove, hereby adopt this resolution.
